PASSION READING 4

LEADER: Then they led him off to Pilate. To avoid ceremonial uncleanness the Jews did not enter the palace; they wanted to be able to eat the Passover.

WOMEN: So Pilate came out to them and asked,

LEADER: "What charges are you bringing against this man?"

CONGREGATION: "If he were not a criminal, we would not have handed him over to you."

LEADER: "Take him yourselves and judge him by your own law."

CONGREGATION: "But we have no right to execute anyone."

WOMEN: This happened so that the words Jesus had spoken indicating the kind of death he was going to die would be fulfilled.

LEADER: They began to accuse him, saying,

CONGREGATION: "We have found this man subverting our nation. He opposes payment of taxes to Caesar and claims to be Christ, a king."

WOMEN: Pilate then went back inside the palace, summoned Jesus, and asked him,

LEADER: "Are you the king of the Jews?"

MEN: "Is that your idea, or did others talk to you about me?"

LEADER: "Am I a Jew? It was your people and your chief priests who handed you over to me. What is it you have done?"

MEN: "My kingdom is not of this world. If it were, my servants would fight to prevent my arrest by the Jews. But now my kingdom is from another place."

LEADER: "You are a king, then!"

MEN: "You are right in saying I am a king. In fact, for this reason I was born, and for this I came into the world, to testify to the truth. Everyone on the side of truth listens to me."

LEADER: "What is truth?"

WOMEN: Then Pilate took Jesus and had him flogged.

LEADER: The soldiers led Jesus away into the palace (that is, the Praetorium) and called together the whole company of soldiers. They put a purple robe on him, then twisted together a crown of thorns and set it on him. And they began to call out to him,

CONGREGATION: "Hail, King of the Jews!"

LEADER: Again and again they struck him on the head with a staff and spit on him. Falling on their knees, they paid homage to him.

WOMEN: Once more Pilate came out and said to the Jews,

LEADER: "Look, I am bringing him out to you to let you know that I find no basis for a charge against him."

WOMEN: When Jesus came out wearing the crown of thorns and the purple robe, Pilate said to them,

LEADER: "Here is the man."

WOMEN: As soon as the chief priests and their officials saw him, they shouted,

MEN: "Crucify! Crucify!"

high priest came by. When she saw Peter warming himself she looked closely at him and said,

WOMEN: You also were with that Nazarene, Jesus.

LEADER: But he denied it and said,

MEN: "I don't know or understand what you're talking about."

LEADER: Just as he was speaking, the rooster crowed. He went out into the entryway. When the servant girl saw him there, she said again to those standing around,

WOMEN: "This fellow is one of them."

LEADER: Again he denied it. After a little while, those standing near said to Peter,

CONGREGATION: "Surely you are one of them, for you are a Galilean."

LEADER: One of the high priest's servants, a relative of the man whose ear Peter had cut off, challenged him,

WOMEN: "Didn't I see you with him in the olive grove?"

LEADER: Then he began to call down curses on himself, and he swore to them,

MEN: "I don't know this man you're talking about."

LEADER: Immediately the rooster crowed the second time. The Lord turned and looked straight at Peter. Then Peter remembered the word the Lord had spoken to him,

MEN: "Before the rooster crows twice, you will disown me three times."

LEADER: And he went outside and wept bitterly.

Very early in the morning, the chief priests, with the elders, the teachers of the law and the whole Sanhedrin, reached a decision. They bound Jesus, led him away and handed him over to Pilate.

When Judas, who betrayed him, saw that Jesus was condemned, he was seized with remorse and returned the thirty silver coins to the chief priests and the elders. He said,

MEN: "I have sinned, for I have betrayed innocent blood."

CONGREGATION: "What is that to us? That's your responsibility."

LEADER: So Judas threw the money into the temple and left. Then he went away and hanged himself.

The chief priests picked up the coins and said,

CONGREGATION: "It is against the law to put this into the treasury, since it is blood money."

LEADER: So they decided to use the money to buy the potter's field as a burial place for foreigners. That is why it has been called the Field of Blood to this day. Then what was spoken by Jeremiah the prophet was fulfilled:

CONGREGATION: "They took the thirty silver coins, the price set on him by the people of Israel, and they used them to buy the potter's field, as the Lord commanded me."

OLD TESTAMENT READING

JOB 14:1-19

- “Mortals, born of woman,
are of few days and full of trouble.
- ² They spring up like flowers and wither away;
like fleeting shadows, they do not endure.
- ³ Do you fix your eye on them?
Will you bring them before you for judgment?
- ⁴ Who can bring what is pure from the impure?
No one!
- ⁵ A person’s days are determined;
you have decreed the number of his months
and have set limits he cannot exceed.
- ⁶ So look away from him and let him alone,
till he has put in his time like a hired laborer.
- ⁷ “At least there is hope for a tree:
If it is cut down, it will sprout again,
and its new shoots will not fail.
- ⁸ Its roots may grow old in the ground
and its stump die in the soil,
- ⁹ yet at the scent of water it will bud
and put forth shoots like a plant.
- ¹⁰ But a man dies and is laid low;
he breathes his last and is no more.
- ¹¹ As the water of a lake dries up
or a riverbed becomes parched and dry,
- ¹² so he lies down and does not rise;
till the heavens are no more, people will not awake
or be roused from their sleep.
- ¹³ “If only you would hide me in the grave
and conceal me till your anger has passed!
If only you would set me a time
and then remember me!
- ¹⁴ If someone dies, will they live again?
All the days of my hard service
I will wait for my renewal to come.
- ¹⁵ You will call and I will answer you;
you will long for the creature your hands have made.
- ¹⁶ Surely then you will count my steps
but not keep track of my sin.
- ¹⁷ My offenses will be sealed up in a bag;
you will cover over my sin.

¹⁸ “But as a mountain erodes and crumbles
and as a rock is moved from its place,
¹⁹ as water wears away stones
and torrents wash away the soil,
so you destroy a person’s hope.

EPISTLE READING

2 CORINTHIANS 4:8-18

⁸ We are hard pressed on every side, but not crushed; perplexed, but not in despair; ⁹ persecuted, but not abandoned; struck down, but not destroyed.

¹⁰ We always carry around in our body the death of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be revealed in our body. ¹¹ For we who are alive are always being given over to death for Jesus’ sake, so that His life may also be revealed in our mortal body. ¹² So then, death is at work in us, but life is at work in you.

¹³ It is written: “I believed; therefore I have spoken.” Since we have that same spirit of faith, we also believe and therefore speak, ¹⁴ because we know that the One Who raised the Lord Jesus from the dead will also raise us with Jesus and present us with You to Himself. ¹⁵ All this is for your benefit, so that the grace that is reaching more and more people may cause thanksgiving to overflow to the glory of God.

¹⁶ Therefore we do not lose heart. Though outwardly we are wasting away, yet inwardly we are being renewed day by day. ¹⁷ For our light and momentary troubles are achieving for us an eternal glory that far outweighs them all. ¹⁸ So we fix our eyes not on what is seen, but on what is unseen, since what is seen is temporary, but what is unseen is eternal.

GOSPEL

LUKE 7:11-17

Pastor: The Gospel according to St. Luke the 7th chapter.

People: **Glory to You, O Lord.**

¹¹ Soon afterward, Jesus went to a town called Nain, and His disciples and a large crowd went along with Him. ¹² As He approached the town gate, a dead person was being carried out—the only son of his mother, and she was a widow. And a large crowd from the town was with her. ¹³ When the Lord saw her, His heart went out to her and He said, “Don’t cry.”

¹⁴ Then He went up and touched the bier they were carrying him on, and the bearers stood still. He said, “Young man, I say to you, get up!” ¹⁵ The

dead man sat up and began to talk, and Jesus gave him back to his mother.

¹⁶ They were all filled with awe and praised God. "A great prophet has appeared among us," they said. "God has come to help His people." ¹⁷ This news about Jesus spread throughout Judea and the surrounding country.

Pastor: We join together in the prayer that He has taught us to pray...

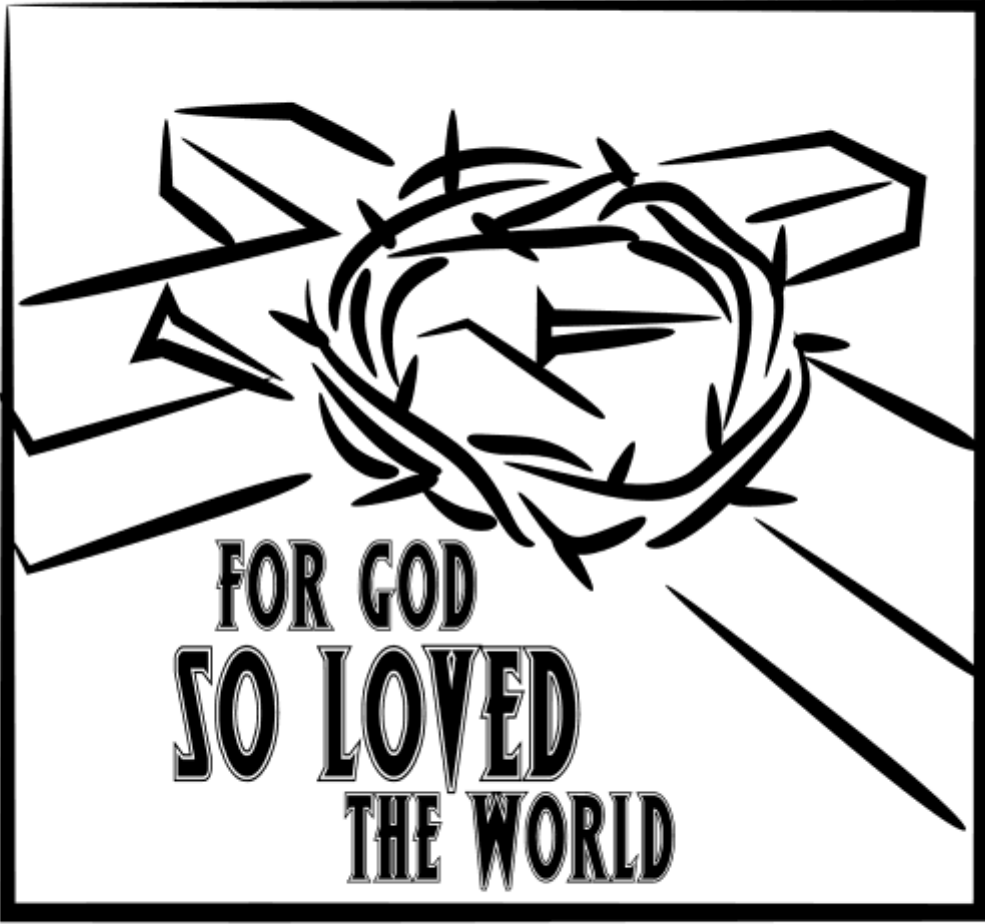

Children's Bulletin & Basket

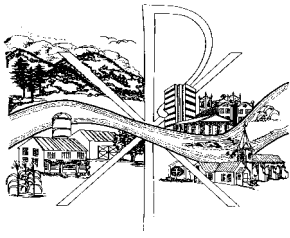
